Position Summary

The Rice 360° Institute for Global Health, at Rice University, through its innovative research and education programs develops highly effective, low-cost technology solutions that address critical healthcare challenges in low-resource communities, as well as a cadre of future leaders to continue to innovate and implement solutions. The Neonatal Essential Solutions and Technologies (NEST 360°) initiative led by Rice 360° has developed a program model to sustainably deploy a bundle of technologies to enable quality, comprehensive newborn care in hospitals in sub-Saharan Africa.

The NEST central QI coordinator, under the supervision of the NEST international programs director and Rice 360° faculty co-directors and NEST360° co-PIs Dr. Rebecca Richards-Kortum and Dr. Maria Oden, will provide high-level coordination and tracking of the implementation of NEST360° program quality improvement (QI) tools. The NEST central QI coordinator, to be based in Malawi or Tanzania, will: coordinate refinement of QI tools; liaise with NEST partner London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) and NEST country teams for scheduling and needed preparations prior to each QI site visit; facilitate prompt QI data entry and feedback to country teams; assist with tracking progress against timelines and milestones; and contribute to periodic technical reporting to granting agencies and sponsors. She/he will provide NEST Co-PIs and country teams in Malawi, Tanzania, Kenya and Nigeria the project management support and guidance they need to ensure accomplishment of all NEST QI activities in line with critical timelines and deadlines.

The ideal candidate has significant project management experience—preferably within global health and international development in Africa and/or maternal, neonatal and child health programs—, with a demonstrated record of accomplishment in successfully managing a multi-sector project with academic, government and private sector partners and is willing and able to travel within and across NEST implementation countries in sub-Saharan Africa.

Job Duties – Role Specific Functions

Coordinate and track the implementation of the NEST 360° program quality improvement (QI) tools, including:

- Coordinate and support activities for the implementation, evaluation and refinement of NEST QI tools
- Liaise with NEST partner London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) and NEST country teams for scheduling and needed preparations prior to each QI site visit, across all NEST implementation sites in Malawi, Tanzania, Kenya and Nigeria
- Facilitate prompt QI data entry and feedback to NEST country teams
- Regular communication with NEST co-PIs and the international programs director on QI tool implementation progress
- Tracking NEST QI tool implementation progress against milestones, making contingency plan recommendations, helping to prioritize decisions that need to be made and work that needs to be done, and trouble-shooting issues that arise
- Contribute to periodic technical reporting to granting agencies and sponsors, including ensuring submissions are prepared well in advance and executed by required deadlines

- Creates and implements plans to achieve program objectives and mission
- Interprets, implements, and ensures compliance with policies and regulations and recommends changes to procedures and processes

- Analyzes data, identifies trends, develops reports and recommends and implements changes to improve alignment with institutional mission and goals
- Creates and implements outreach plans that may include relationship development, communications, event and conference management
- Provides support in developing relationships with internal and external entities
- May assist with fundraising activities
- Creates budget plans, monitors and approves expenditures, develops reports, conducts analyses and maintains financial records
